TAKE ACTION

There are many steps homeowners can take to improve their home's survivability and your family's safety from an approaching wildfire. These include:

- ☐ Clearing gutters, rooflines, decks, and landscaping of pine needles and other ignitable vegetation
- ☐ Establish survivable space around structures with well-spaced, healthy vegetation and landscaping around the home
- ☐ Utilize fire-resistive building materials when constructing your home
- ☐ Ensure your address is clearly visible from the street view
- ☐ Sign up for emergency notifications
